Location 1: Stone Town, Zanzibar (Unguja Island)

June 29 - Arrive at Karume International Airport, Zanzibar / On-the-ground Introduction to Program, Staff, Housing, and Stone Town World Heritage Site

June 30 - Meteorological Station for Presentation by Chief Meteorologist of Zanzibar / Lunch with Key Program Partners in Zanzibar / Swahili Language Lesson #1 (all lessons are 30 minutes followed by an activity or reflection)

July 1 - Meet with Three Faculty at Institute of Marine Science and State University of Zanzibar / Presentation on Climate Change Impacts to Coastal Ecosystems and Human Livelihoods / Swahili Language Lesson #2

July 2 - Two Secondary Schools to Discuss Environmental and Climate Education in Classrooms / Lunch with Key Community Partners in Zanzibar / Swahili Language Lesson #3

July 3 and 4 - Pange Sandbar and Chumbe Coral Park / Snorkel on Conserved and Biodiverse Coral Reefs Impacted by Recent Climate Change / Discuss Conservation, Ecotourism, and Environmental Education for Community, School Students, and Tourists in Era of Climate Change / Swahili Language Lesson #4 / Reflection
